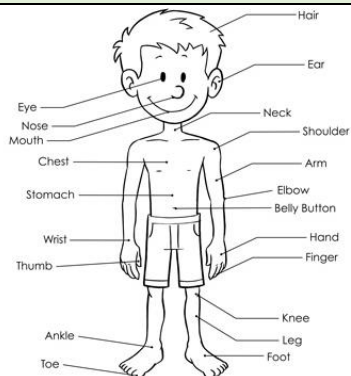
Tier 2

Tier 3

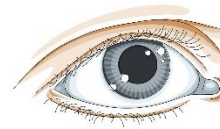
Pleasant, unpleasant

Name and identify parts of the human body



Sight

- The eyes allow you to see.
- Sight allows us to know the colour, shape, size and location
- Sight is better in the daytime when it is bright so we turn on a light to help our sense of sight see more



Sound

- The ears allow you to hear sound.
- Sounds can be loud or quiet (and in-between)
- Sounds identify animals by using your senses



Taste

- The tongue allows you to taste
- Some foods taste sweet and some taste sour



touch

- The skin allows you to touch
- Touch allows us to sense hot or cold, warm or cool
- Touch allows us to know the texture of an object



Smell

- The nose allows us to smell
- Smell can tell us about food
- There are pleasant smells and unpleasant smells
