### Home – School Agreement

#### Introduction

We wish to promote a culture of ‘working in partnership’ to create an environment whereby children have consistent expectations at home and at school. We encourage mutual respect, support and collaboration between all adults and children, both within the school and the wider community.

Through a consistent approach to promoting school values and high expectations, we can support children in achieving their best and develop a sense of pride and mutual respect in every child.

We believe that this can be achieved most effectively when all Governors, staff, parents and pupils understand their responsibilities and work together as detailed in our Home – School Agreement.

#### Aims

- To provide clarity on the roles and responsibilities we all have to ensure we develop the whole child – academically, socially, morally and emotionally.
- For Governors, staff, parents and pupils to have a sense of belonging to Silverstone CE Primary School.
- To promote respect for the school values and school policies.
- To work together to promote effective safeguarding procedures.
- For staff, governors, parents and the community to work in partnership with one another to develop the skills needed to enable the children to become independent learners; to be responsible and to be compassionate member of society.

#### Silverstone CE Primary will:

Marking should be done during the lesson (developmental marking), or as soon as possible after the completion of the task (distance marking) and always before the next teaching session of that subject using the marking codes described in this policy.

- Ensure your child is well taught and achieves their full potential.
- Provide a stimulating and enriched curriculum to develop and sustain a love of learning for life.
- Value each child as an individual and celebrate your child’s academic and personal achievements.
- Promote good standards of behaviour.
- Help your child to develop a positive attitude to others and a sense of responsibility.
- Set relevant/age appropriate homework to extend the curriculum and provide further opportunities for independent learning. This will be age/ability appropriate.
- Inform parents/carers promptly of any concerns regarding the progress or behaviour of their child.
- Listen and respond to any concerns from pupils or parents/carers.

- Provide information about the schools to parents/carers, including relevant policies, newsletters, curriculum updates, activities etc.
- Regularly communicate with parents/carers regarding the progress of their child including their achievements, areas of development and how they can support their child's learning.
- Be welcoming and offer parents opportunities to become involved in the daily life of the school.

**As a Parent / Carer I will:**

- Ensure my child attends school regularly and arrives punctually by 8:50am
- Inform the school of any absence of my child by 9.00am on the first day of absence.
- Make sure that my child wears school uniform/suitable clothing and footwear that it is appropriate for the weather and is clearly marked.
- Work in partnership with the school including supporting school policies.
- Support the school in implementing positive and respectful behaviour.
- Read ParentMail/letters from school and reply when required by the given date.
- Work with the school in supporting my child's particular needs, including support with homework activities.
- Inform the school of any external circumstances/change of circumstances or any other issues which are concerning my child or which may have an effect upon my child's behaviour or progress.
- Attend discussions/meetings regarding my child's progress and how I can help my child at home.
- Discuss with an appropriate member of staff any queries, issues or concerns relating to the school or my child.
- Refrain from commenting on any school related matters on social media.
- Only post images on social media of my own child and not other children without gaining consent from their parents
- Support the wider school community and help with FOSS events when possible.

**As a pupil of Silverstone CE Primary I will:**

- Learn Together
- Arrive at school on time.
- Wear my school uniform correctly.
- Try my hardest at all times.
- Follow Silverstone CE Primary's Golden Rules.
- Respect and look after the school environment and school equipment.
- Tell my teacher if I am having difficulty with my work so that my teacher can help me.
- Tell my teacher if I have any concerns or worries about anything.
- Follow all school rules when on school trips and when representing Silverstone CE Primary.
- Behave appropriately whenever I am in my school uniform outside school.
- Do my homework to the best of my ability and hand it in on time.
- Follow online safety rules at school and at home.
